**B.S. Criminal Justice** Deven was a quick and athletic cornerback for the University of Cincinnati who was selected as an undrafted free agent to the **Detroit Lions** in 2014 who went through Rookie minicamp and multiple reviews with the Lions. Deven was made recommendations, reduced weight, increased strength and has improved in his craft over the past season and now can run the 40 at excellent **4.34** from last year's 2014 time of 4.52. **As a result, the Detroit Lions have invited Deven back to camp for 2015!** Deven has the special ability of being a defense back that can play multiple positions including corner, nickel and even safety which NFL scouts love to see. This kind of talent creates unpredictability on the field for the opposition. As a result, as a senior Deven had a team high three passes intercepted and defended a total of eight passes. tied Cincinnati's interceptions in a single season in 2013 and defended on. Deven actively played for the Bearcats as a team leader on the field for 4 seasons and became a well productive player overall according to many scouting reports. Deven is now available as a free agent.

He generated 25.5 tackles on the season and accumulated 85 return yards on his three picks for an average of 28.3. - Cincinnati football Over the last two seasons, he has totaled 16 pass breakups and five interceptions to go along with superb run defense from several positions including corner, nickel and even safety. Drane impresses with his physicality when asked to come up and jam receivers at the line and possesses the natural suddenness and explosiveness to mirror receivers downfield.



**2012:** Completed two solo tackles and one pass breakup vs. South Florida (11/13) ... made a season-high fives against Rutgers (11/17), including one solo tackle for loss yardage ... had four solo tackles and broke up a pass against Louisville (10/26)...recorded one tackle vs. Toledo

(10/20)...had a 76-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown vs. Fordham (10/12) ... posted four total tackles ... had a 33-yard interception return vs. Miami (OH) (10/06) ... made four stops against Virginia Tech (09/29) ... recorded three unassisted tackles and two pass breakups against Delaware State (09/14) ... in home opener vs. Pittsburgh (09/06), totaled two tackles and broke up one pass.

**2011:** Played in all 13 games as a defensive back ... ended the season with 42 tackles, nine pass breakups and three interceptions ... began the season with two solo tackles for a one yard loss against Austin Peay ... returned one kick off for 20 yards at Tennessee ... also credited with a tackle assist and pass breakup ... broke up two passes and caught one interception against Akron ... recorded two solo stops ... recovered one fumble against NC State ... also broke up two passes and totaled two tackles ... gained 43 yards off of an intercepted pass at Miami (OH) ... caught third interception at USF ... also earned six total stops, including for solo takedowns ... made five tackles for a net loss of one yard at Pittsburgh ... earned four solo stops against West Virginia ... had three assisted tackles at Rutgers ... also recorded one solo stop and one pass breakup ... made eight solo tackles at Syracuse, along with one broken pass ... had five total stops against Connecticut ... also broke up a pass ... finished with three tackles and one broken pass against Vanderbilt.
