2014-2015 WEST GEORGIA:

Started 15 games for the wolves at Tight End and also contributed in the FB rotation. Targeted 4 times on the year with 4 catches that totaled for 60 yards. Longest reception was for 20 yards and came against Shorter University. Used primarily as a blocking TE in a powerful running offense that ranked 1st in total rush yards in the Gulf-South Conference and 20th in the country in total rush yards for NCAA Division 2. Also saw playing time on kickoff return and punt team for the Wolves. Finished the year with GSC 2nd team All-Conference honors and BSN 1st team All Super Region 2 honors.

2013-2014 WEST GEORGIA:

Played in nine games for the Wolves as a junior with five starts at the FB position. Used heavily in the Wolves powerful run game at fullback and H-Back. Caught 2 passes on the year for 15 yards.

AT NEWBERRY:

Started his true freshmen year for the Newberry College Wolves where he played for two seasons. In his two year tenure at Newberry he started a total of 17 games at Fullback and Tight end and caught 2 passes for 18 yards.
