### 2012/2013 Season:

### 2011 Season:

### 2010 Season:

The valuable player was named SoCon of All Freshman Team and started all 11 games in which he totaled 40 tackles (26 solo and 14 assisted), including four for a loss of 13 yards. In addition he totaled three interceptions for 32 yards returning.

During the 2009 season, Boateng earned the SoCon Defensive Player of the Week for impressive performance at No. 21 North Carolina opening game of the season, recording two interceptions for 20 yards and a season-high of seven total tackles, five solo and two assisted tackles.

### Northwest H.S.:

The 2008 High School graduate was co-captain of the team and named the team Most Valuable Player. Boateng was also a member of the 2006 Regional Championship team that went undefeated during the regular season, under coach Andrew Fields and Randy Trivers.
