Jordan McAdoo started 30 games in his career at Emporia State and was a huge reason the team went 11-3 his senior year. Jordan helped running backs gain over 2400 yards on the season. With extremely long arms and great size, Jordan was able to play both the tackle and guard position for the Hornets. Jordan's strength along with his quick feet and hands allows him to be highly effective blocking in both the run and pass game. Being a top NFL draft prospect from Emporia State, Jordan has proved his quick decision making and size are NFL Caliber. He was invited to four different All-Star games. Jordan started in the 2016 Dream Bowl this past January in Virginia Beach, VA and helped his team to a victory.



Experience:

2015: Was able to fight back from injury and started all 14 games for Emporia State at Right Tackle. Helped get the team to the National Quarter Finals in Division 2 and an 11-3 season. Jordan won SquareHead award for best offensive line performance for Emporia 3 times his senior year. Was named to the **MIAA All-Conference** list as well as the **USA College Football All-American** list.

2014: Jordan didn't see much action this season due to injury. He was able to start in 3 games and see action in 6 games on the season.

2013: The sophomore started 5 games and saw action in all 12 games for the Hornets. Jordan helped lead Emporia State to a 9-2 record as well as first playoff berth in two decades. He was able to play four of five positions on the offensive line. Jordan earned SquareHead award for best offensive line performance for Emporia State once on the season.

2012: Jordan started 9 games as a redshirt freshman and saw time in all 12 games. Played four of the five positions on offensive line. He helped the team to a 10-2 season as well as a Kanza Bowl victory. This was the best record in 20 years for Emporia State. He earned the SquareHead award for best offensive line performance for Emporia State once.
