

Roderick was a quick and athletic running back for the Clemson Tigers who was a reserve RB most of his college career at Clemson playing behind NFL RB Andre Ellington, but emerged into the starting RB role for Clemson in 2013 and had 1,699 yards on 318 carries and 12 touchdowns along with 34 receptions for 231 yards and two touchdowns in 950 snaps over 46 games (10 starts) in his career ... eighth in school history in yards per carry (5.4), fifth in the ACC, a well productive player overall according to many scouting reports who is now available as a free agent.

2013:

Roderick “Hot Rod” McDowell as they call him was part of the Third-Team All-ACC Selection and Third-team A had a team-high 1,025 yards on 189 carries and five touchdowns along with 29 receptions for 199 yards and two touchdowns in 603 snaps over 13 games (10 starts). In addition he had four 100-yard rushing games, he was third in the ACC in rushing yards per game (78.8) and ninth in all-purpose yards per game (98.2), he had a team-high of 61 yards on 11 carries and three receptions for 11 yards against #5 Florida State on Oct. 19, had 161 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries and four receptions for 11 yards for 172 all-purpose yards at Maryland on Oct. 26; named team co-offensive player-of-the-game.



2012:

Roderick had 450 yards on 83 carries and five touchdowns along with three receptions for 29 yards in 244 snaps over 13 games, 11 yards on four carries and a touchdown against #25 Auburn at Atlanta, GA on Sept. 1. McDowell had a team-high 59 yards on eight carries and a 27-yard touchdown run against Ball State on Sept. 8 in which he had 27 yards on six carries and a 16-yard touchdown run at Boston College on Sept. 29. He also had 56 yards on nine carries and two touchdowns along with a 23-yard reception against Georgia Tech on Oct. 6, 47 yards on three carries against #12 South Carolina on Nov. 24 and had 26 yards on seven carries and two receptions for six yards against #7 Louisiana State in the Chick-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31.

2011:

Roderick had 63 yards on 14 carries and one touchdown along with one reception in 44 snaps over 13 games, six yards on two carries against #11 Florida State on Sept. 24, a five-yard rush and one reception against Boston College on Oct. 8, 17 yards on three carries against North Carolina on Oct. 22 and 34 yards on four carries and a touchdown against #22 West Virginia in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 4.

BEFORE CLEMSON:

McDowell played his last high school game in the state championship game in Death Valley under coach Paul Sorrells, he had 1,399 yards on 158 carries and 28 total touchdowns as a junior. He also had 1,892 rushing yards and 23 touchdowns as a senior. In addition he was the Shrine Bowl participant, he was invited to the U.S. Army All-American game and he was the member of the All-America Top-250 team by PrepStar. Roderick was rated as the #25 running back in the nation by ESPN.com and #4 running back/member in the nation by Rivals.com. He was rated the #6 player in South Carolina by Rivals.com, #48 running back in the nation by Scout.com, #22 running back in the nation by SuperPrep, #7 player in South Carolina by SuperPrep and #38 player in the ACC by Athlon.
