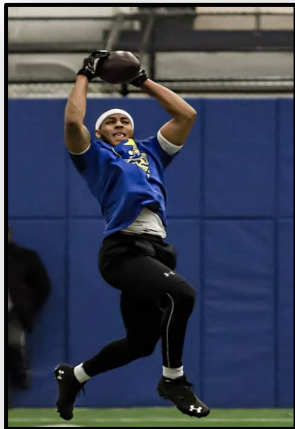

2014 : Fifth Year Senior of the Blue Hen's squad as a transfer from NCAA FBS Boston College as a graduate • started at strong safety (#7) while also lending his efforts to special teams unit • fifth-year senior enrolled in UD fashion apparel design graduate certificate program after earning his degree from Boston College in May 2014 • Defensive player of week against Villanova.

• Boston College Play Experience:

2013: Saw action in 12 games at defensive back and on special teams as a junior • notched 15 tackles, including nine solo tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss of eight yards and 0.5 sack • made one tackle against Florida State • recorded two tackles and sack against Virginia Tech • posted three solo tackles at Maryland • tallied season-high five tackles (three solo) at Syracuse.



2012: Saw action in seven games as a redshirt sophomore • started at cornerback in two games - at Northwestern and Clemson • competed in 342 plays on the year between defense and special teams • tallied 13 tackles (nine solo) on the season • recorded a season-high five tackles and a fumble recovery at Northwestern • made three tackles (two solo) vs. Clemson • posted two solo stops at Wake Forest.

2011: Named to ESPN's ACC Top Player to Watch List • Played in two games as a sophomore, vs. Northwestern and at UCF • suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening kickoff at UCF • received a medical hardship waiver for the season • made four stops, including three solo tackles, in first career start against Northwestern.

2010: Appeared in 12 games as a true freshman • tallied 16 total tackles on the season, including six unassisted • recorded a career-high six tackles against Virginia • assisted on two tackles at Duke • assisted on two tackles at Florida State • recorded two tackles at North Carolina State • assisted on a tackle for loss against Virginia Tech • recorded two tackles against Weber State.

HIGH SCHOOL:

Selected as the 2009 Gatorade Delaware Football Player of the Year at A.I. DuPont High School for head coach Zeb Blum • earned All-State and All-Blue Hen Conference honors as a senior defensive back/quarterback • part of a defense that recorded seven shutouts and allowed just 2.7 points per game • four-year varsity team captain • ran for 1,114 yards and 19 touchdowns on 114 carries as a senior when he led the Tigers to a 10-1 mark and a berth in the state Division I semifinals in 2009 • also competed on the track and field team, establishing several school records • state champion in the 400 meters in 2010 when he led the team to its first-ever state title. At the 2009 Elite Combine, CJ posted the fastest 40 yard time running the event in 4.37 seconds • As a result of his defensive skills and outstanding play, CJ was selected as one of the top All Stars to play in the North East vs. New Jersey Football Classic which was televised in June 2010 on the NFL Channel network • CJ was also named to the U.S Army All Combine Team as a Defensive Back and was ranked among the top DB recruits in the nation by both Rivals and Scout magazine • Being multitasking, CJ was recruited for three positions at the D1 level, as a QB, WR and DB • Highly recruited by some of the top D1 programs in the nation, CJ choose to accept a football scholarship offer to attend Boston College where he will played and stated as a Defensive Back • CJ received football scholarship offers from Rutgers, Duke, Louisville, N.C. State, East Carolina and Temple and was on the radar of Wisconsin, Michigan, Stanford, UNC, Penn State, Maryland and UVA football programs as a recruit • CJ is also talented in the classroom posting a 3.2 grade point average and was named to the National Honor Roll and America's Who's Who as one of the top academic students in the country.
